Maths

Rec: We have been learning how to create AB and ABC patterns in different ways. Children copied and continued patterns using coloured blocks, instruments, body percussion and duplo. They created their own AB patterns using peg boards.

Y1: Children have been practising adding by counting on by holding a number in their head and counting on on their fingers. We have introduced subtraction by counting back.

Y2: Children have been counting on and back from different numbers in 10s and using this to work out word problems.

Topic

In Art, children used chalk and charcoal to make observational drawings of fruit and vegetables. In History, children have started an information booklet about the great fire. In PSHE, children have learnt about the golden rule 'We are gentle' and added this to their poster. In Science, children put their sense of taste to the test and tested different flavours that were sweet, salty, sour, bitter and umami. Children decided what food they thought would have these tastes.
